1. Children at Play Sign – Wellington Road

Ericalyn O'Connor, 150 Wellington Road, requesting a "Children at Play" sign to be installed on Wellington Road, between Newmarket Road and Stratford Avenue.

Traffic Survey: Wellington Road, between Newmarket Road and Stratford Avenue, dated November 17, 2021, provided by Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department.

The Traffic Commission, at the November 18, 2021, Meeting, deferred this request asking for review by the perspective Property Owners' Association.

The Traffic Commission, at the January 13, 2022, Meeting, voted to defer this item as it will be included within the Satellite Traffic Calming study.

Deferred until after the Thursday, May 19, 2022, Public Hearing, and a review of report.

Deferred at the June 16, 2022, Meeting.

Deferred at the September 15, 2022, Meeting.

November 17, 2022, Meeting: Deferred.

2. Do Not Enter Sign – Wetherill Road

Nicholas Acquavito, 215 Wetherill Road, between Bayberry Avenue and Old Country Road, requesting consideration of "Do Not Enter" signs, for weekdays during rush hour, to be installed on Wetherill Road at Old Country Road and Bayberry Avenue at Washington Avenue.

Traffic Survey: Wetherill Road, between Old Country Road and Bayberry Avenue, dated November 17, 2021, provided by Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department.

The Traffic Commission, at the November 18, 2021, Meeting, deferred this request asking for review by the perspective Property Owners' Association. The Traffic Commission, at the January 13, 2022, Meeting, voted to defer this item as it will be included as part of the Satellite Traffic Calming study.

Deferred until after the Thursday, May 19, 2022, Public Hearing, and a review of report.

Deferred at the June 16, 2022, Meeting.

Deferred at the September 15, 2022, Meeting.

November 17, 2022, Meeting: Deferred.

3. Sixth Street and Hilton Avenue – Right Turn Only Lane
William Bellmer requesting consideration of adding a right turn only lane on westbound Sixth Street at Hilton Avenue.

November 17, 2022, Meeting: Deferred for a review of the area.

4. Old Country Road and Linden Street – No Thru Traffic Sign
Len and Alma Aspalto, 11 Linden Street, requesting consideration of a no thru traffic sign at the corner of Old Country Road and Linden Street during the hours of 7:00am-10:00am.

Traffic, Accident and Bus Stop Surveys: Linden Street, between Old Country Road and Bayberry Avenue, provided by Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department.

Deferred at the September 15, 2022, Meeting.

November 17, 2022, Meeting: Deferred.

5. Raymond Court - Parking Lot Sign
Discuss restoring the Raymond Court parking lot sign that was removed last week as the parking lot is closed except for events that are expected to draw more than 135 vehicles, involve parking school buses or for other special circumstances.

Deferred at the September 15, 2022, Meeting, for a review of signage.

November 17, 2022, Meeting: Deferred with a request to Public Works and Building Departments to design a plan for Clinton Road to Raymond Court Parking Field.

6. Trustee Kelly requested review of the following:
 - c. Reduction of Village-wide speed limit to 25mph and school speed limit to 15mph.
November 17, 2022, Meeting: This item requires legal review.
 - d. Installation of “No Parking 3:00am-6:00am” restriction in Parking Lots 8, 9W and 10.
November 17, 2022, Meeting: This item is for Board of Trustees review and approval (Reference New Business 1.e. New Parking Lot Signs).
 - j. Addition of stop signs on Kensington Road at Somerset Avenue.
November 17, 2022, Meeting: Deferred.
- **STATUS UPDATE ON ISSUES REFERRED TO NASSAU COUNTY FOR STUDY/ACTION**
On January 4, 2023, Mr. Suozzi, Village Administrator, sent a follow-up email to Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, Nassau County Department of Public Works, requesting a response to his December 2, 2022, letter and December 12, 2022, email. He also sent an email to Legislator Laura Schaefer on January 4, 2023, requesting her assistance in addressing these issues.
 1. **Cambridge Avenue and First Street – Left Turn Difficulty at Intersection**
Traffic Commission Action: At the January 11, 2018, Meeting, the Traffic Commission voted to refer to Nassau County a request to study the installation of a traffic light at the intersection of Cambridge Avenue and First Street (heading east from Cambridge Avenue).

 December 8, 2020, email from Nassau County Department of Public Works advising “this request for a traffic signal investigation is in our queue and will be conducted as soon as workload permits”.

 March 24, 2021, email from Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, Nassau County Department of Public Works, advising that the warrant study has been submitted with signal denial. The Village will be notified on the determination.

 January 13, 2022, phone call to Harold Lutz, P.E., Director of Traffic Engineering, Nassau County Department of Public Works, to follow up on the determination letter.

 The Traffic Commission, at the March 17, 2022, Meeting, requesting the Village submit additional data to Nassau County for reconsideration of this matter.

 Nassau County Department of Public Works to update the Village by the end of July 2022.
 2. **Clinton Road – Intersection Humps**
Traffic Commission Action: At the October 18, 2018, Meeting, the Traffic Commission voted to refer to Nassau County asking them to smooth out the intersection humps along Clinton Road.

Nassau County, Department of Public Works, has agreed to meet with the Village to discuss solutions to this issue. A meeting is tentatively scheduled for Friday, January 24, 2020.

January 24, 2020, meeting with Village Officials, Members of the Nassau County Legislature and Nassau County Department of Public Works to discuss a plan of action to address the intersection humps along Clinton Road. It was decided that the Village would initiate a study of the area, funded by Nassau County.

December 8, 2020, email from Nassau County Department of Public Works requesting to “meet with the Village and revisit an Inter-Municipal Agreement (IMA)”.

At the January 14, 2021, Traffic Commission Meeting, Trustee Minuto requested the Department of Public Works to reach out to Nassau County Department of Public Works regarding their December 8, 2020, email.

March 24, 2021, email from Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, Nassau County Department of Public Works, advising that Nassau County has completed its traffic analysis and will be contacting the Village sometime in the next few weeks to go over the findings, pending nothing major redirects their resources.

Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, Nassau County Department of Public Works, has advised the Village that a design document has been issued by Nassau County.

Nassau County Department of Public Works to update the Village by the end of July 2022.

3. Intersection at Franklin and Stewart Avenues – Light Timing/Signal Changes
Traffic Commission Action: At the May 23, 2019, Meeting, the Traffic Commission voted to refer to Nassau County asking them to review the light timing/signal changes at the eastbound intersection at Franklin and Stewart Avenues.

December 8, 2020, email from Nassau County Department of Public Works advising they have “no record of recent requests for timing/signal changes at the intersection of Franklin Avenue.” They will “contact Commissioner Ken Jackson to coordinate and further discuss the Village’s concerns”.

At the January 14, 2021, Traffic Commission Meeting, Commissioner Jackson advised that Nassau County Department of Public Works has not reached out to him regarding their December 8, 2020, email; Trustee Minuto requested he reach out to them.

January 28, 2021, email from Commissioner Jackson to Mary Studdert, Nassau County Department of Public Works requesting a review to determine if this request is warranted.

March 24, 2021, email from Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, Nassau County Department of Public Works advising “We did field review the signal but did not observe anything out of the ordinary – possibly due to lower Covid volumes”. Commissioner Jackson will be contacted by Nassau County to discuss.

Commissioner Jackson would like a follow up of this request since traffic is picking up after the lower volumes that were possibly due to Covid.

May 12, 2022, email from Joseph G. Pecora, P.E., Deputy Commissioner, County of Nassau, Department of Public Works, advising Commissioner Jackson that this request is being reviewed to determine what changes/improvements may be warranted.

Commissioner Jackson is in contact with Joseph G. Pecora, P.E., Deputy Commissioner, County of Nassau, Department of Public Works. This request is being revisited by Nassau County.

4. New Hyde Park Road Intersections

Traffic Commission Action: At the September 16, 2021, Meeting, the Traffic Commission voted to request Nassau County to a) install “No Turn on Red” signs in all directions on New Hyde Park Road and Stewart Avenue, add pedestrian crossing signals in all directions and review the location for possible installation of red-light cameras and b) install a traffic light on New Hyde Park Road at Dartmouth Street with an east/west crosswalk on the north side of the intersection as well as a blinking “Traffic Light Ahead” sign for northbound traffic on New Hyde Park Road approaching the intersection.

c. Stewart Avenue and New Hyde Park Road

- Installation of “No Right Turn on Red” signs on each of the four corners of Stewart Avenue and New Hyde Park Road
- Installation of Pedestrian Walk/Don’t Walk crossing indicators on each of the four corners of the intersection
- Installation of cameras to monitor the intersection

b. Dartmouth Street and New Hyde Park Road

- Installation of a traffic stop, three-light signal and pedestrian crosswalk at the intersection of Dartmouth Street and New Hyde Park Road

September 28, 2021, letter to Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, County of Nassau, Department of Public Works, requesting review of the above-referenced items for Stewart Avenue and New Hyde Park Road and New Hyde Park and Dartmouth Roads.

November 22, 2021, email from Joseph G. Pecora, P.E., Deputy Commissioner, County of Nassau, Department of Public Works, advising that “we will schedule studies for both New Hyde Park Road at Stewart Avenue and at Dartmouth Street to evaluate your requests.”

Commissioner Jackson, Garden City Police Department, will study the area and data will be forwarded to Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, County of Nassau, Department of Public Works, by Mr. Suozzi, Village Administrator.

Nassau County Department of Public Works to update the Village by the end of July 2022.

5. Merillon Avenue and Rockaway Road Design
Traffic Commission Action: At the June 16, 2022, Meeting, the Traffic Commission requested this item be added to the list of items referred to Nassau County for study/action.

Mr. Suozzi was asked by the Traffic Commission to reach out to Kenneth Arnold, P.E., Commissioner, Nassau County Department of Public Works for an update.
6. Hanging Left Turn Only Sign – Southbound Seventh Street and Cathedral Avenue
At the June 16, 2022, Meeting, the Traffic Commission advised this item is under consideration by Nassau County.
7. Clinton Road Issues and Traffic Study on Clinton Road from Meadow Street to Commercial Avenue
At the June 16, 2022, Meeting, and again at the September 15, 2022, Meeting, requests for a complete traffic study on Clinton Road between Meadow Street and Commercial Avenue; Trustee Kelly discussed the feasibility of asking Nassau County to install a traffic light at the intersection with Garden Street or Poplar Street.
8. Left Turn Signal – Washington Avenue and Eleventh Street
At the September 15, 2022, Meeting, the Traffic Commission requested consideration of having the left turn signal activated from 2:00pm-5:00pm.
9. Rockaway Avenue
At the November 17, 2022, Meeting, the Traffic Commission referred the request for consideration of a “Right Turn Only” sign on the right-hand lane going south on Rockaway Avenue and the addition of two to three arrows painted on the street.
10. Nassau Boulevard
At the November 17, 2022, Meeting, the Traffic Commission requested Nassau County consideration of the addition of “Left Turn” signals on Nassau Boulevard, southbound and westbound at Stewart Avenue, to be consistent with eastbound and northbound “left turn” signals at that intersection; addition of grid box for the intersection.
11. Franklin Avenue
At the November 17, 2022, Meeting, the Traffic Commission advised that the request for the addition of a “Left Turn” signal on northbound Franklin Avenue at

Seventh Street to relieve congestion and enhance pedestrian safety in crosswalks would be referred to Nassau County for review.

- NEW BUSINESS

1. Trustee Kelly is requesting review of the following:

- a. Addition of three left turn arrows on the roadway pavement of Cathedral Avenue southbound approaching Seventh Street.
- b. Addition of “No Right Turn on Red” signs at the intersection of New Hyde Park Road and Stewart Avenue.
- c. Addition of “No Left Hand Turn” signs Monday-Friday 7:00am-10:00am from Old Country Road onto Lefferts Road, Prescott Street, Wetherill Road, Maple Street, Maxwell Road and Linden Street.
- d. Addition of a crosswalk from the end of the south sidewalk on South Avenue to the north side sidewalk of South Avenue.
- e. New Parking Lot Signs:
 - Parking Field No. 8 – “No Parking 2:00am-6:00am” for two rows closest to residences
 - Parking Field No. 9W – “No Parking 2:00am-6:00am” for the two rows closest to residences for the entire length of the parking lot
 - Parking Field No. 10 – “No Parking 2:00am-6:00am” on single row of spaces on north, south and west side (perimeter)
