Should the situation change, the Commission will discuss possible changes to this system. b. Three residents spoke to the Commission regarding conditions on the playing fields at St. Paul's. There is concern that the grass is not in good condition, and that improvement is needed. The current turf management program was reviewed, and Mr. Blake expressed that what is really needed at these fields is for them to be rested from time to time. Mr. Blake went on to say that all of the small "window" fields adjacent to Stewart Avenue, and two large fields will be taken out of service at the conclusion of the spring season, and will receive substantial renovations over the next year. A meeting was scheduled at the St. Paul's Fields to review the treatment program as well as the current conditions of the field. c. A resident spoke to the Commission urging the establishment of an indoor swimming pool in the
Villlage.
