- Community events




Engagement Events



- 11 stakeholder groups over 2 days, about 50 people attended

- Over 110 residents participated at the Garden City pool event









Engagement Events – Dollar Voting






Random Sample Mail Survey

- 5-page recreation survey mailed to 2000 households
- 407 completed surveys
- Margin of error of +/-4.81% at the 95% level of confidence
- Purpose – to accurately represent the population as a whole


Web/Handout Survey

- 2-page recreation survey available to anyone
- 652 completed surveys
- Purpose – to reach as many people as possible

Parks Visited

Over 60% visited 20 or more times

Less than 7% did not visit




Quality of Facilities

Over 70% feel facilities are in good or excellent condition


Only 5% feel facilities are in poor condition







Approximately half participated in 1 to 5 events/programs


27% of Mail Survey and 18% of Web Survey respondents did not participate











Dollar Voting - Survey





Support for a Tax to Improve Parks and Recreation






